


IAHR WATER MONOGRAPHS PROCESS

O1. Proposal Submission

Authors begin by submitting a proposal form to the IAHR Water Monographs Task Force for approval.

02. Manuscript Preparation

Authors can choose between a Word or LaTeX template for their manuscript.

03. Submission

Focus on creating a clear and consistent manuscript, ensuring proper units and equations for readability and accuracy. Final formatting and typesetting will be managed by IAHR upon acceptance.

04. Peer Review

Each manuscript is reviewed by three independent reviewers, coordinated by an Editor from the IAHR Water Monographs Task Force, who has no affiliation with the content.

05. Sponsorship

Authors' Publishing Charges are typically covered by a sponsoring company, institution, or funding source. In return, sponsors receive significant benefits associated with Open Access.

O6. Design, Typesetting, and Proofreading

IAHR handles this process with highquality standards until final confirmation before publication.

07. Publication Timeline

The average time from submission to publication is approximately six months. IAHR Water Monographs are published as Open Access, and printed copies can be ordered on demand.

08. Visibility

IAHR Water Monographs are promoted through various IAHR channels, including our website, targeted mailings to over 28,000 contacts and promotional activities at events . They are also indexed in Google Scholar.
